

MINUTES
BLACK AND GOLD BOOSTER CLUB

OCTOBER 15, 2007

The regular meeting of the Black and Gold Booster Club was held on October 15, 2007, at 6:30 P.M. in the High School cafeteria. The meeting was called to order by President, Brad Schields. Ten members were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer, Steve Duell, announced the Treasurer's Report with an ending balance of \$10,319.38. It was moved and seconded to approve the same as presented. Steve announced that Wilkens Truck & Trailer donated \$1,000 to pay for the letters to be placed on the Jr. High Gym. Brad Schields announced the amount paid to Western Associates for decals was \$367.55 instead of \$402.51 as stated was due at the September meeting. The order had been adjusted and the new amount should be \$367.55. Brad further announced he had received bills from GTM Sportswear in the amount of \$338; and Sara Lee Bread for buns the club is donating for the upcoming football feed in the amount of \$24.42. Brad further announced he had received requests from Girls' Golf; GAA; and FCCLA for \$50 for each of their organizations. It was moved and seconded to pay GTM; Sara Lee; and each of the organizations with the exception of the Girls' Golf which has already been paid.

Correspondence: None.

Old Business: There was earlier discussion to help with a meal to feed the Hugoton football team as well as the Goodland football team on October 19th. Micki Scherling reported that there are plenty of volunteers and they will serve hamburgers, chips, baked beans and cookies in the High School cafeteria. There should be approximately 145 people.

Colleen Duell announced she had given the club's scholarship outline to Nancy Farris and it was also on the club's website.

Concerning signage for the junior high gym, Steve Duell announced the letters are in and he will get with Kenny Studer to place them on the building.

Don Smith announced he had handed out/placed in mailboxes, the yearly letters to the organizations explaining that each group is entitled to \$50 from the Booster Club.

New Business: Steve Duell explained the new proposed 2007/2008 budget. It was moved and seconded to approve the budget as presented.

Charlene Mangus asked whether or not the club would be interested in advertising in the musical program this year. After discussion, it was moved and seconded to place a half-page ad in the musical program at a cost of \$40.

Brad Schields announced he had received a request from the Topside Tipoff committee whether or not the club would be interested in placing an ad in the program this year. It was moved and seconded to place the same ad as last year at a cost of \$50. Brad also announced that the Topside committee had offered the concession stand to the Booster Club again this year. The committee will get together to go over details for the stand.

Brad Schields announced that he has six youth shirts that he has asked the cheerleaders to throw out at the upcoming football game against Hugoton. It was decided that the club would donate the shirts to be thrown out at the game.

Charlene Mangus asked whether or not the club would be interested in helping purchase two new microphones for the Music Department. The microphones now are ten to twelve years old and need updating. The microphones can be used for the musical and other speakers that come to the school. It was moved and seconded to donate \$200 to the Music Department for the microphones. The

Music Boosters will donate an additional amount to purchase the new microphones.

After discussion, it was moved and seconded to set a maximum \$200 donation limit from the Booster Club on travel expenses for state competitions.

There was discussion from the club concerning the following committees:

Membership: Colleen Duell reported the club currently has 108 members.

Merchandise: No discussion.

Spirit and Hospitality: No discussion.

Ways and Means: No discussion.

The next meeting will be November 19, 2007, at 6:30 P.M. in the High School cafeteria. Meeting was adjourned.
